Welcome to The Gordon Highlanders Museum


This is The Gordon Highlanders Museum

Museum Staff and Volunteers all wear a dark green name badge.




You can be shown around by a Volunteer Guide or use an Audio Guide Handset on a Self-Guided Visit.

The Museum is on two floors. There are stairs between floors and a lift.



This is the Cinema. It is quite dark. There is an introductory film playing. The film plays on a loop and lasts 11 minutes. You can sit and watch it.



This is the Grant Room.

You can learn about the history of The Gordon Highlanders from 1794-1994. You can see uniforms, memorabilia, weaponry and medals, film and touchscreens. There is a one-way route through the room.





**This is a replica WW1 trench.
The space is quite dark.
There is a film that lasts 17
minutes and plays on a loop.
You can sit and watch it.**



This is the Armoury.

You can see firearms and weaponry in cases and medals in the metal cabinets by the wall.





This is the Silver Room. You can see trophies, quaiches and Mess Silver. The lighting levels are lower and being a small gallery, there is not much space.



This is the Hamilton Room.

You can see our temporary exhibition in here. The lighting levels are quite low in here and you can hear Pipe Music.



**This is the Regimental Dining Room.
You can see lots of silver on the dining table that the
Gordons used. The room is alarmed and will make a loud
noise if anyone leans over the rope barrier.**



You can visit our WW1 replica trench by signing up for a tour at reception. Please note, these tours are available on a first-come, first-served basis and are subject to weather conditions.



The fire alarm makes a loud sound. If you hear it during a visit, Museum staff will guide you out of the building through the nearest fire exit to gather at the Sentry Box in the car park. Do not go back inside the building unless a member of staff tells you it is safe.
